pression of doubt today from the Dominion department of justice.

The dispatch said that the colonists were expelled from Canada at the outbreak of the war or field to escape internment and found refuge in Seattle. Bellingham, Tacoma and other cities of the northwest.

"We have expelled no German farmers, except perhaps operationally one who would be classed as undestrable," was an assertion made by the deparment today, "Some have fled to excape interment posselby, but not many. Some have been warned and then sent buck to their farms. Very

few have been interped. Most of them are too husy with the harvest to create much frouble even if they were inclined to do so. On the whole, the German farmer of the west has been well behaved?
