

## Startling Revelation.

Ottawa, Aug. 11.—Among the twenty-nine Germans and Austrians whose applications for naturalization papers in Ottawa are now awaiting judicial consideration are two Germans, who have described themselves under the heading of "occupation" as being members of the Canadian Ordnance Corps. Why Germans who have not yet taken out naturalization papers should be employed in handling Canada's guns and ammunition is a question both for the court and the Militia Department to consider. It may be noted that there are still in the Government employ in various Departments of State a number of German-born citizens, whose sympathies in the war are, to say the least, not decidedly pro-British.
