

SITE FOR ALIEN CAMP

Work on One at Revelstoke Was Commenced Last Week.

Revelstoke, Aug. 7.—Capt. Palmer, of the Royal Canadian Engineers, Ottawa, arrived in the city today and, on behalf of the military authorities, inspected the proposed site for the alien detention camp in the Revelstoke park. He found the site satisfactory and gave it formal approval.

The camp will be occupied as soon as it can be prepared. Some 200 aliens will be brought from Brandon to work on the automobile road up the park. The guard will consist of from 50 to 100 soldiers. Lieut. Frank Stead, officer commanding No. 19 company, Army Service Corps, was in the city yesterday, arranging for supplies and transportation.

Work on preparing the camp for the reception of the aliens started this morning. The camp site, which is eight miles from the Big Bend road will be fenced and bunk house, cook house and hospital will be built of logs. A log building for storing supplies will also be erected.
