

GERMAN ARRESTED AT BRIGHTON, ONT.

**Said He Was Travelling Photo-
grapher—Had Views of a
Number of Bridges.**

Brighton, Ont., Aug. 19—A German named Leib was arrested here yesterday and taken to the detention camp at Kingston. Leib had been in town several days, under the name of Lee and had been boarding at a private house in the village. On Sunday night he went to Charlotte, N.Y., on the steamer Caspian, but was turned back by United States authorities who notified this port to examine him on his return. On examination he said he was a German who had been in Canada three years and gave his business as travelling photographer. He had a number of postcard views and several photos he had taken. All the pictures were of bridges, etc., three being different views of Belleville bridge. He had visited the lake shore towns surrounding here and several small places to the north.
