AMHERST CAMP ENQUIRY

Few Malcontents, Majority of

Germans Satisfied Ottawa. August 25 .- It is stated that when the Government was informed that a protest to Germany was planned by some of the war prisoners at Amherst, N.S., an official of the Justice Department was despatched to the scene to investigate and the United States consuls at Halifax and Moncton were also asked to make an inquiry into conditions at the internment camp. Their finding was that the trouble arose from a few irreconcilables and that the great majority of prisoners were satisfied with the treatment accorded them.
