

DYNAMITE FOUND IN WOODS DISAPPEARS BEFORE POLICE ARRIVE

The St. Boniface police are working on a dynamite story which they fear is part of an alien enemy plot. Late Wednesday afternoon Willie Sinclair, of Oskin avenue, Norwood, while walking with his mother in the bush near their home, which is adjacent to the main line of the C.P.R., saw a brown paper box, about twelve by twenty-four inches in size marked in large letters, "Dynamite, high explosives." It was partially concealed in the grass.

Willie's mother also inspected the box. They did not touch it. The boy told his teacher, Principal C. H. Rattan, of Tache school. The police were notified and hurried to the scene. The box had been removed, a partial hole remained. The police think they have a clue to the persons who received the dynamite.
