from the Indians of the presence of the Austrians in the vicinity, with the result that he communicated with men were arrested.

The men when they left camp took with them a supply of spikes, with which they were able to conwith which they were able to struct refts to cross the rivers. It was the discovery of one of these about a week ago which led to a hot chase after the fugitives. Lieut M. La Doyls, of the Spirit Lake in-

ternment camp, started out, accom-panted only by one guide, in pur-suit of the men, and they made the journey to Gillies Bay in less than a week. They found traces of the fugi-tives throughout the journey, but by the time the officer reached Gillies Bay his quarry was already safely in custody in Ville Marie.
