

PROVINCE WILL MAKE EFFORT TO HELP UNEMPLOYED

Alberta Government Follows Suggestion of the Hon. T. W. Crothers

Following out the suggestion made by Hon. T. W. Crothers this week, it is asserted that the provincial government has already under consideration the formulation of some organized effort to attack the problem of unemployment. In what detail Mr. Crothers' ideas will be adopted is yet undecided, but there is a probability that a provincial conference will be held.

It is the intention that this be attended by the mayors of the larger centres, or by accredited representatives and by all those people who might be expected to be in close touch with conditions and able to suggest some possible remedies. Failing a convention statements as to conditions will be obtained and suggestions received. The government members who have thought of the matter appear inclined to the opinion that it will be much easier to reach a mutual agreement, as to the burden of expense, with the federal authorities if the recommendations come from a representative convention.

Some action in the matter will be taken in the near future, so that plans may be made before winter arrives.
