

FOREIGN BORN POPULATION

Census Department Prepares Data Made from Census of 1911.

A special report on the subject of foreign-born population in Canada has been prepared by the Census department. While the figures, being an abstract from the 1911 census, are not new, they are nevertheless of interest, having regard to the war conditions which prevail. Of more particular interest are the figures showing the distribution of the "foreign born population." That term covers people born outside of Canada as distinguished from persons of foreign parentage, but who were born in Canada.

The Grand Total

In June, 1911, the total foreign born population was 752,732, distributed as follows: British Columbia, 105,097; Alberta, 142,711; Saskatchewan, 162,610; Manitoba, 95,688; Ontario, 148,764; Quebec, 74,421; New Brunswick, 8,134; Nova Scotia, 10,972; Prince Edward Island, 932; Yukon, 3,316; Northwest Territories, 87.

The Nationalities.

The principal divisions by nationalities are: Austro-Hungarians, 121,430; Germans, 39,577; Italians, 34,739; Norwegians and Swedes, 49,194; Russians, 1,666; Chinese, 27,683; United States, 302,680.

The Distribution.

The foreign born population is mainly in the West and in Ontario. Alberta has 3,170 Germans, 9,996 Austro-Hungarians, 7,237 Norwegians, 5,619 Russians and 805 French. Saskatchewan has 14,691 Austro-Hungarians, 9,516 Russians, 1,506 French, 4,258 Germans, 7,688 Norwegians. In Manitoba there are 1,864 Germans, 15,787 Austrians,

6,624 Russians and 2,355 Norwegians. Ontario has 10,420 Austrians, 7,871 Germans, 11,305 Italians, and 3,025 Norwegians.
