

AUSTRIAN FLEES

TWICE, IN JAIL

Martin Baraszczuk, an Austrian, who is notorious by two successful attempts to break out of concentration camps, appeared in the city police court today on a charge of attempting to break into a North Winnipeg shoe store Friday night. He was remanded to Monday.

Last May, Baraszczuk was interned at Brandon. He had not been there long when he escaped. Aided by his fellow prisoners, Baraszczuk hid himself beneath a table over which was spread a blanket, and around which a number of men played cards.

With a sheath knife Baraszczuk cut a hole in the floor boards and escaped.

After three months, the Austrian was arrested while robbing a hen roost at Brooklands. He was handed over to the military authorities and held under close guard at Fort Osborne barracks here.

Ten days ago, while the guard's back was turned, he made a leap through a window on the second story of the executive offices building. Although shots were fired at him by the sentries, he got away.
