

Bulgaria Makes Her Choice.

Bulgaria's rulers seem to have concluded that their fortunes will be better sustained by an alliance with the Germanic allies than with Russia and the other powers. If action is taken at Sofia, as now seems to be intended, an invasion of Bulgaria, direct or through Greece, may be made as a way of reaching both the Bulgars and the Turks, and that would give occupation to a large army, which Italy might supply. The die is not yet cast, however, and late events may have made the Bulgarian leaders more prudent than they seemed to be a week ago. The situation is one that will be watched with interest, if not anxiety. Bulgaria has not a great army, and will likely have to fight Greece as well as Serbia and western invaders; but her position is strategically important, and a new army might cause awkward complications. The hope for success is centred in the western field.
