hetter sustained by an ailiance with the Germanic allies than with Russia and the other powers. If action is taken at Sotia, as now seems to be intended, an invasion of Bulgaria, direct or through Greece, may be made as a way of reaching both the Bulgars and the Turks, and that would give occupation to a large army, which Italy might supply. The die is not yet cast, however, and latevents may have made the Bulgarian leaders more prudent than they seemed to be a week ago. The situation is one that will be watched with interest, if not anxiety. Bul
