1,000 PRISONERS IN BRANDON CAMP

There are more than a thousand prisoners of war interned at Brandon at the present time. These figures were given out by a man who arrived from Brandon today.

Many curious stories are told of how some of these enemies of the Allies got into the camp and chances are the majority of them will stay

there until the war is over.

One man said "Serve her right" when hearing about the murder of Edith Cavell; another tried to drink the health of the kaiser in a Brandon hotel and, in addition to being beaten up, was taken by the military authorities; one gloated over the Lusitania being torpedoed by a submarine. Some in the camp are German and Austrian citizens who failed to register and were found out while others were caught trying to leave the country.
