

UNDERGROUND RAILWAY TO U.S

Geo. Lemm, of Estevan, Charged With Aiding Germans to Cross Boundary

Grand Forks, N.D., Nov. 9.—A modern underground railroad doing a flourishing business between North Dakota and Canada has been unearthed by the Canadian Mounted Police, and they have arrested George Lemm, of Estevan, Canada, charging him with proprietorship.

According to the complaint against Lemm, he is accused of transporting, for pay, Germans and Austrians out of Canada to the United States. It is alleged that the Germans and Austrians desiring to depart from Canada paid Lemm a certain sum; the latter would then pack them in his automobile, guaranteeing to deliver them at some point in North Dakota. Noonan, in the extreme west end of North Dakota is said to have been one of the ports of entry for this cross-boundary business.

Lemm was taken to Regina to face the charge of aiding alien enemies of Canada to escape from the country.
