GERMAN MADE MUNITIONS Paul Jokel Interned Once Before, Sent to Prison, Interned Again.

Col. Grazett, Registrar of Aliens, to-day interned Paul Jokel. Jokel, a man with a perpetual smile, is a German, who was taken from a

munitions factory in Hamilton and sentenced to six months in the Central Prison for theft and forgery. It was while a prisoner that the authorities learned that he was the same Jokel who escaped from Kapuskasing camp about a year ago.

"He is the most dangerous kind of a German," said Inspector Kennedy to-day. "He was employed as a clerk in a wholesale house in Spadina avenue, and they valued his services so highly that they thought they could not get along without him. When he was interned he smilingly told us that he was a German and strongly unti-ally. We interned him, but he made his escape and went

to Hamilton. There he secured work in a factory manufacturing munitions. He had been working there for some time before he was arrested and convicted of theft, and torgery. We were notified and rearrested him when he was discharged from the prison.

"He is an intelligent man, well

"He will do his smiling at either Fort Henry or Kapuskasing until the war is over," said inspector Ken-

nedy to-day.
