

GERMAN MADE MUNITIONS

Paul Jokel **interned** Once Before,
Sent to Prison, Interned Again.

Col. Grasett, Registrar of Aliens, to-day interned Paul Jokel. Jokel, a man with a perpetual smile, is a German, who was taken from a munitions factory in Hamilton and sentenced to six months in the Central Prison for theft and forgery. It was while a prisoner that the authorities learned that he was the same Jokel who escaped from Kapuskasing camp about a year ago.

"He is the most dangerous kind of a German," said Inspector Kennedy to-day. "He was employed as a clerk in a wholesale house in Spadina avenue, and they valued his services so highly that they thought they could not get along without him. When he was **interned** he smilingly told us that he was a German and strongly anti-ally. We **interned** him, but he made his escape and went to Hamilton. There he secured work in a factory manufacturing munitions. He had been working there for some time before he was arrested and convicted of theft and forgery. We were notified and re-arrested him when he was discharged from the prison.

"He is an intelligent man, well educated, and one who is capable of doing a lot of damage."

Jokel is a man of medium height, of a stocky build, well dressed, and wears glasses.

"He will do his smiling at either Fort Henry or Kapuskasing until the war is over," said Inspector Kennedy to-day.
