Baseball Team Change Stripes for Khaki Uniform

Guelph, Ont., January 4.—During the past season the baseball team of the Province of Ontario Prison Farm at this city, cleaned up the independent teams of this part of the country one after the other. About all that these men drew for their services was the sentence imposed by the judge. They played their games under guard but enjoyed liberties not accorded other prisoners. Now the "Giants," as they called themselves, have enlisted their entire team in various battalions. Fifteen of the Giants have changed their uniforms of stripes for the King's uniform of khaki. Others will do so as soon as their sentences expire.

A hockey team will be ready for games in a few days and is anxious to take a crack at the team of interned Germans at Fort Henry in Kingston. It is not considered even slightly probable that the authorities will stand for any such engagement.
