


MANY BIG MEN TAKE OATH


Naturalization Act Shows Prominent
Citizens Who Have Taken the
Oath

A reminder that United States has furnished Canada with many of her great men in the political, railway and commercial world is furnished by a list of persons to whom certificates of naturalization have been furnished under the Nationalization Act recently passed, up to December 31st of last year.

The first eight names on the list are those of Hon. Sir George Halsey Perley, Lord Shaughnessy, Sir William Van Horne, E. J. Chamberlain and Howard G. Kelley of the Grand Trunk railway; E. G. Deville, surveyor-general of Canada; C. F. Sise, Jr., manager of the Bell Telephone Company, Montreal; and P. F. Sise, vice-president and general manager of the Northern Electric Company, Montreal, all born in the United States. Further down the list appear the names of Charles Newton

Candee, vice-president of the Gutta-Percha Rubber Company of Toronto; of Jacob Lewis Eglehart, chairman of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway; and of Elmer Randolph Carrington, vice-president of the Thiel Detective Service, Montreal, all former Americans. Baldwin Larus Baldwinson, deputy provincial secretary, Winnipeg, a former native of Denmark, has also been naturalized, as have, under another section of the Naturalization act, Gustaf Heldmann, secretary to the minister of marine and fisheries, and John Henry Stanford, civil servant.
