

TWO GERMANS WERE TAKEN FROM U.S. TUG RAMOS AT ST. JOHN

Protest is Made, But the
Arrest is Legal—One Prefers
to Remain in Canada

St. John, N. B., Jan. 27.—Herman Fulkandort and William Warren, German subjects, were taken from the American ocean-going tug Ramos here yesterday and removed to the Amherst internment camp. A protest was made, but as the tug had entered here and was clearing of Spencer's Island, Nova Scotia, the arrest was legal.

Fulkandort said he preferred to remain in prison in Canada to the end of the war, to returning to Germany, whether he had been summoned. His father and three brothers have been killed, and every man from eighteen to forty-five in their little village in Saxony had already been at the front.
