PRECAUTIONS WILL BE TAKEN

Protection is Now Being Afforded Many Places—Citizens Are Urged to Co-

Operate.

Extra precautions will be taken to assure the safety of the legislative buildings at Victoria and other public buildings in the province from incendiarism and possible attacks of other nature, according to intimations given this morning.

Military officers pointed out that protection was at the present time being amply afforded in places where it was deemed necessary, but no chances will be taken anywhere.

For some time past the public has been seemewhat apathetic about reporting enemy aliens. Citizens are strongly urged to communicate to military officers or to the police suspicious conduct of any kind on the part of persons who may be regarded as possible enemies. Such reports will lead to thorough investigations by men qualified for the work.

Inspector Wynne of the previncial

Inspector Wynne of the provincial police force stated to The World this morning that a watch was being kept on the courthouse and other government buildings in Vancouver and always had been kept since the beginning of the war. Whether an extra precautions would follow the incident at Ottawa was a question to be decided by Superintendent Campbell, who is in Victoria. No instructions have been received yet.
