German Woman Is Deported From W.I.

NEW YORK, Feb. 4—Mrs. Paula Jurgensen, wife of a German steamship captain, who asserted she was expelled from the British island of Jamaica upon five days' notice by the governor, Sir W. H. Manning, arrived here last night on the steamship Carrillo. At the beginning of the war Mrs. Jurgensen and her husband, Capt. Albert Jurgensen, an employe of the Hamburg-American Atlas line, were interned in a camp near Kingston. Mrs. Jurgensen said that many of those interned at the outbreak of hostilities have been sent to Canada.
