

H. PETERS AT HAMILTON COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Hamilton, Feb. 9.—Harry Peters was this morning committed for trial on the charge of being an **alien enemy**. Among the papers found on him was a list of names of soldiers arranged alphabetically, a letter from the Mayor of Berlin, and a letter from a woman signed, "Yours until Niagara Falls." The Magistrate considered the papers were suspicious.

Peters Loyal, Says Col. Martin.

Berlin, Ont., Feb. 9.—Harry Peters, who was arrested in Hamilton to-day and committed for trial on charge of being an alleged spy, is well and favorably known in Berlin. Col. Hilkiah Martin of the 118th Battalion stated to-night that Peters is not a German spy, but is a loyal British subject. He has been selling photographic cushion tops to soldiers in camps in all parts of Canada. Col. Martin is confident that the Hamilton police have made a mistake. Peters was engaged in the men's furnishing business here for many years.
