

LET GO WITH WARNING.

But Walter Meyer Must Give Bond for Behavior.

Berlin, Ont., Feb. 10.—A true bill was brought in by the Grand Jury in the case of Rex vs. Walter H. Meyer, charged with having on December 5th uttered seditious statements against the King's soldiers.

The prisoner was immediately arraigned and pleaded guilty. W. H. Brewster, K.C. of Brantford, Crown counsel, moved for sentence, and D. S. Bowlby, for the prisoner, after reviewing the case, asked for the mercy of the court. Crown counsel agreed that sentence be suspended in his case, as the prisoner had already made a public apology in the local press.

Justice Chute, in giving him his freedom, bound him in \$500 bonds to keep the peace and strongly pointed out the seriousness of the offence, observing that it was our duty as Christian people to prevent these unpleasanties in this trying time of world-wide war.
