Alters the Cause.

Cronn's Rathskeller was marked

for attack because the proprietors are Austrians. A big illuminated sign, "Rathskeller," that was particularly offensive to the soldiers, was taken down yesterday afternoon. It was rumored that Kolb's restaurant was employing German help and the name was objectionable.
