## TRIES TO ENLIST IN GERMAN ARMY AT WINDSOR, ONT.

Teuton Asonished When He
Finds Himself In British
Country—Is Arrested

WINDSOR. Ont., Feb. 12—Speaking in broken English, and with an undoubted Teutonic accent, a man giving his name as Hans Schmidt and his home as Toledo, Ohio, landed in Windsor yesterday with the avowed intention of allying himself with the forces of the kaiser, which he had heard were being mobilized here.

Schmidt confided to the government officials at the ferry dock that
he was looking for the German recruiting office, and seemed much
surprised when he was turned over
to the military guard and hustled
off to the armory, to be held until
he can be transferred to an interior
city where he will be interned till
the end of the war.

Ethmidt informed the authorities that he "loved the kaiser," and he supposed the recruiting posters were to aid the fatherland. He said he

had no idea he was in Canada.

He is a German army reservist. He later said his plan was to reach the Atlantic coast and stor away in a steamer bound for Holland and from there make his way into Germany. He will probably be sent to Kingston and interned.
