

CALLS FALLIS OF PEEL A "BRAZEN POLITICIAN"

Rev. Byron Stauffer Says Preachers Have Duty to Perform

"German-born Government employees in responsible and confidential positions should be dismissed, or at least put into unimportant positions," said Rev. Byron H. Stauffer yesterday morning in his sermon at Bond Street Congregational Church, on "Lessons From the Ottawa Fire." "War justifies grave suspicions. We should safeguard every place of danger; public buildings should be guarded, and after that we should be extremely careful lest panics are needlessly created. The woe-ful experiences in Calgary and Ed-monton show what we can do if we are foolish.

"We should not attribute all possible calamities to the enemy. We forgot the Front street fire of years ago. We forgot that we had a fire in our Legislative building here before the war. When teamsters strike for a few cents more a day how easy it is to allege alien agitators. With a quarter of a million people in our midst who are trying hard to be loyal in spite of every tile of blood, we ought to be extremely careful lest we upset our fine record of the past eighteen months."

Referring to the coming bye-election in Peel county, Mr. Stauffer said: "We are not patriotic enough to rise up against a brazen politician who dares 'fess up' and come back for re-election. The preachers of Peel county certainly have a patriotic duty on hand for the next ten days. We should fear if we re-elect Mr. Fallis that the German Phillistines will hear it and rejoice."
