

THINKS MONEY WOULD BE SENT TO GERMANY

Col. Sherwood Seeks to Have Court Judgment Suspended— Suspects German Cunning.

MONTREAL, Feb. 15.—Action was taken in the practice division of the Supreme Court of Quebec by Colonel Sherwood, as chief commissioner of the Dominion police, to suspend a judgment rendered in the Ontario court in December last, in which one Otto Herald was awarded \$37,000 against Max Budding, whose address was given as "Amsterdam, Holland," but who, it has since transpired, is a German. It is believed he is at the present time serving as an officer in the kaiser's army. The German was connected with the purchase by Budding, early in 1913, of two C. P. R. farms in Ontario, and their transfer at the outbreak of the war to Herald. Certain obscure arrangements touching on the transaction by which Herald was to buy Budding out, aroused suspicion.

Colonel Sherwood states he has good reason to inquire if Herald has not been in collusion with Budding with the purpose of forwarding this money to Germany. His intervention, is therefore, directed to stopping of monies to an alien enemy.

The case will be heard next Thursday.
