

WANTS TO SELL STOCK

C.P.R. Shares Belong to Man Fighting for Kaiser—Collusion Charged.

Montreal, Feb. 22.—The case in which Col. Sherwood, chief of the Dominion police, is seeking, under the federal Trading With the Enemy act, to prevent Otto Herold exacting a judgment rendered by default in Toronto against one Max Budding, a German, at the present time believed to be fighting with the kaiser's army, came before Mr. Justice Guerin in the Practice court yesterday, on a motion of Herold seeking to compel Col. Sherwood to provide security for costs.

Wants to Sell Stock.

In the execution of the judgment in question Herold seeks to dispose of certain C. P. R. stock belonging to Budding, and Col. Sherwood urges that the two men are acting in collusion in order that money may be realized on the stock and forwarded by Herold to Budding. The amount to be realized on the stock affected by the judgment is between \$32,000 and \$37,000. Petitioner sought a

stay of judgment in order that inquiry might be made into the case.

Case Delayed.

Justice Guerin said he was not certain that the court could hold an investigation on a demand by Col. Sherwood. He ordered that proceedings be served on the federal minister of justice so that he might take what action he considered proper. In the meantime the present case was adjourned until Monday next.
