Electric Wiring Believed the Cause—Loss \$300,000; Cost Million to Rebuild

Montreal, Mch. 1.—Fire starting in the fie rom destroyed the Bonaventure station of the Grand Trunk Railway this morning. The cause is

thought by the police, after the first investigation, to have been electric wiring. An investigation will be held. The loss is estimated at three hundred thousand dollars as the building was an old one, but it will cost over a million to erect a new build-

ing. The station was used by several other railways, including the Delaware and Hudson and Canadian Government Railways.

News quotes a "subordinate railway official" as claiming that there was no doubt that it was caused by Germans. Vice-president Kelly, however, speaking for responsible officials, said

speaking for responsible officia's, said the cause was a short circuit in the stationery department. The loss is fully covered by insurance.
