

FRENCH AVIATORS DO GOOD WORK

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Paris, March 2.—To-night's official statement says:

"Last night one of our bombing squadrons dropped forty-four shells of all calibres on the station at Chambley, which appeared to have suffered serious damage. Notwithstanding a lively cannonade, the aeroplanes returned in safety to our lines.

"To-day our aeroplanes likewise dropped forty shells on the railway station at Bendsdorf, and nine projectiles on the enemy establishments at Avricourt."

Ten Austrians Taken to Internment Camp

Stratford, March 2.—Ten Austrians, posing as Russians, secured work as laborers in the G.T.R. shops here recently. Their disguise was too thin, however, for some real Russians employed in the big plant found that their supposed compatriots were unable to speak the Russian language. To-day the ten alien enemies were taken to an internment camp.
