SAYS COMMANDER AIDED PRISONERS TO ESCAPE. OTTAWA, March 2—In the Senate today Senator Cloran gave notice that

he would move for a return of all Germans, Austrians and Hungarians in the employment of the Canadian Government, their names and positions; also the names and addresses of all

Canadians in the employment of the Governments of Germany, Austria

and Hungary.

Senator Cloran moved for papers connected with the escape of German

prisoners from the camp at Amherst and the court-martial which followed in Halifax. He said that not only were the prisoners allowed to escape, but their escape was facilitated by the

commander of the camp. Every one knew this was a fact, but he wanted an official confirmation or denial. It was bad enough to "send our own flesh and blood to fight the enemy in a foreign country, without being betrayed at home."

He said that the officers who had allowed Germans to escape should be in the penitentiary or in their graves. "Let us have no traitors in the camp, and let not the Government support them nor shield them," declared the

Senator.
The motion for papers was adopted,
