

Busy German Now Interned

Former Lieutenant of Artillery Was Busy Stirring Up Sedition Among Farmers

Berlin, Ont., March 22—Chief O'Neil and a Dominion police officer made an important capture on a farm near Floradale when Heinrich Hansing was arrested for neglecting to comply with the registration regulations. Hansing has been busy discouraging young farmers from enlisting by telling them that the Kaiser was bound to win and that after the war it would be "Deutschland ueber alles." The officer investigated the belongings of their man and found indisputable evidence that Hansing was formerly a lieutenant in the second Baden Field Artillery Battery and that in 1911 he was on the German warship Karlsruhe, sunk off the Canary Islands about a year ago. He also has in his possession newspaper clippings of German victories and numerous cartoons of the Kaiser. There were also letters addressed to pro-German newspapers in the United States which have been banned from Canada. Hansing is a typical German in appearance and has been removed under military guard to the internment camp at Fort Henry.
