

SENATOR CLORAN STATES HE DID NOT DIRECT HIS ATTACK ON COL. MORRIS

The subject of the escape of alien enemies from the detention camp at Amherst was again brought up in the Senate yesterday by Senator Girroir, who paid a tribute to the ability and integrity of the officer commanding, Col. Morris. He said that Senator Cloran had informed the Senate that the officer had allowed the prisoners to escape, and he thought Senator Cloran should express his regret at the language he had used.

Senator Cloran said he had not attacked Col. Morris, his remarks being directed at the officer intimately charged with the safe keeping of the prisoners. Senator Boyer said he could not understand how a houseful of sentries could watch the prisoners digging themselves out for three days and then be declared innocent by a court martial. Senator Gordon said that the court martial had shown that the grossest carelessness had prevailed at the detention camp.
