Private Cain Worked on Rubber
Plantation in
Brazil

HEARD NEWS, ENLISTED

Employers Carefully Concealed
All Reports of Hostili-
ties

Windsor, April 1.—For a year after war started, Mr. Cain, an Englishman, worked contentedly for a German firm of rubber planters in Brazil. He worked contentedly for that whole year because he did not know that there was a war. His employers were careful to keep the knowledge from him and from the other Englishmen working for them.

Then came leave-day and they learned all about the onrush of Kultur. Mr. Cain took the first boat for the United States and came on by express to Windsor, where he joined the 99th Essex Battalion. Though he is a Cambridge University man he did not trouble about taking out a commission. It was fighting the Germans he wanted.
