was held on Saturday afternoon in the office of the Commissioner of Immigration, J. Bruce Walker. Those present at the conference included Major-Gen. Sir William D. Otter, K.C., who is in general charge

of the detention camps of the Dominion; officials of the C.P.R., C.N.R., Bankers' Association and Grain Growers' Association. It was arranged that as the list of available men in the camp at

Brandon was exhausted, special trains would be operated from Cochrane west, and if necessary 2,000 men would be brought from the camps near that place to Brandon. The cost of this transportation may be borne by the Federal

Covernment Farmers using this labor will be

required to take each man for a period of seven months, to pay the current rate of wages, and to report

once a month to the commandant of the camp.
