

# INTERNED GERMANS TO WORK ON FARMS

New York, April 12.—An Associated Press despatch from Chicago to-day says: Several thousand interned Germans in Canada will be put to work in the fields of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta this spring and will be paid the regular wages of farm laborers according to W. W. Cory, of Ottawa, Canadian Deputy Minister of the Interior, who is in Chicago to-day. A number of the interned men have expressed a willingness to break camp monotony by going into the fields. Mr. Cory said, and it is believed many of them will take homesteads after the war.
