ACTON. Ont., April 21.—Forty alien: who were brought from a New Ontario interment camp to work in a tannery here, and who were the causof a demonstration on the part of several hundred of the townsfolk night

before last, will be sent back to internment as soon as men can be obtained to fill their places. This promise was made yesterday to a committee of citizens.

There have been about 100 Austrians

employed at the tannery here for years and a number of them own property here. At the outbreak of the war most of them were interned and it was thought bringing them back to their old positions would be a solution to

thought bringing them back to their old positions would be a solution to the difficulty of filling vacancies caused by enlistments. The action was resented by the citizens and other ensemble of the tamers, who failed the homes of the Austrians breaking the windows but using no other violence.
