ed Police are scouring the south country and watching the border. The prisoners used implements stolen from the kitchen for the tunneling. They used a mine fan made by one of them for supplying them

with air while tunneling, and made candles out of grease and tallow. Each man who escaped carried a knapsack with provisions saved from the daily meals and stolen from the

An investigation has been held by Major Birney in charge of the camp. He has frustrated many plots by the German prisoners. Only a few weeks ago two prisoners escaped by eluding the guards at night and crawling under fences.
