BRIGADE AT PETAWAWA Four Batteries Reach Last Training Ground Before Going Overseas,

ammunition column, which were quartered at the Artillery Park, Exhibition Camp, reached Petawawa camp to-day. They said farewell to Toronto yesterday afternoon, and the brigade left on two special trains for Petawawa, the summer home of all

the artillery units in Canada.
Lieut.-Col. A. C. Windeyer received a telegram to-day from Lieut.-Col. Odell, announcing their arrival.

The 12th Brigade will make up one

of the six brigades that will be camped at Petawawa this summer, making it the largest artilery concentration camp that Canada ever saw. Incidentally this district will be with-out any trained batteries, which when with the infantry engages in sham fights gives the war tirge to

the mimic battles. The guns—16 shiny big fellows including two 16 pound British field pleces, were loaded on flat cars, wedged to the floor of the cars and

locked together in fours to prevent them from tearing away on the journey. The horses, over 350 in all, were comfortably placed in palace horse cars after they had been un-

shod, the brigade farriers having been busy since Thursday, when they got the orders for unshoeing. Although it is only Petawawa for the present, the artillery are now on their final stage to England. The crowds were intense and a guard furnished by the 180th Sportsmen's Battalion, under the command of Lieut. Harold O'Rourke had to lock hands
