COMMANDER AT PETAWAWA

Col. Ogilvie, O.C., 15th Brigade, Has Been Selected.

Ottawa, May 29.—Col. A. T. Ogilvie, one of the best known artillery officers in Canada, who is Commander of the 15th Brigade, Canadian Field Artillery, stationed at Victoria, will command Petawawa Camp this summer. Virtually all the artillery units in Canada will be located at Petawawa. Col. Ogilvie will bring cast with him his brigade, which consists of the 59th Battery, Winnipeg; 60th, Regina; 61st, Lethbridge, and 62nd, Victoria, with Brigade Ammuniton Column.
