DRAW FULL-RANK PAY Change Announced for Those Attend-

ing School of Instruction. Special to The Star by a Staff Reporter Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ont., May 29. -Lieut.-Col. A. Gregory, Camp Commandant at Petewawa, is in conference with Gen. Logic this afternoon, respecting administration at Artillery Camp. Col. Sidney Mewburn, A.A.G.,

Lt.-Col. Caldwell, Lt.-Col. S. C. Osburn, and Major Milson, will visit Camp Borden Thursday to see how work is progressing. It is likely that this visit foreshadows the general en-

try of troops into Camp Borden. The units in Toronto, ready for camp, will most likely go to Camp Borden during the third and fourth

weeks in June. Major Milsom, A.D. of S. and T., arrived at Niagara to-day and is one of the busiest men on the staff. Changes are announced this after-

noon by Gen. Logie in the arrangements under which officers and N.C.O.'s attend Schools of Instruc-tion. The order states "Officers and

N.C.O.'s regularly appointed to C.E.F. units will on and after May 25th be permitted to draw pay and allowances of rank to which they have been appointed while attending

schools of instruction, instead of receiving pay and allowances of a private. This amendment does not apply to supernumerary and attached

officers or non-commissioned officers in excess of authorized establishment of a C.E.F. unit. Above amend-

ment takes effect from above date and officers and N.C.O.'s drawing pay and allowance of their rank will

continue on pay lists of their own

units and will only receive at the school itself such subsistence allow-

ance to which they may be entitled. Care must be taken that only pay and field allowance is claimed by the

unit, not rations or subsistence.
Gen. Logie has issued a peremptory order that the "Y.M.C.A. is out of bounds to all troops during drill

hours."
