Hamilton, July 3.—Cable advices to-day stated that Lieut.-Col. John I. McLaren, Commanding Officer of the 19th Battalion, was returning to Canada, and would be given a brigade command at Camp Borden. Major W. R. Turnbull will probably succeed him as Commanding Officer of the 19th. Lieut.-Col. W. W. Stewart, Commanding Officer of the 86th Machine Gun Battalion, has been given the command of the Machine Gun Training School.

## Still Need 841 Men.

The number of men now needed here for overseas is 841. During June only 149 recruits were secured. The 71st Battery has been asked for a draft of fifty men and one officer.
