

OVERPOWERED GUARD; ESCAPED TO STATES

Interned Kingston Germans Seize
Launch and Make Good Their
Sensational Escape.

Kingston, July 5.—Three Germans made a sensational escape from the internment camp at Fort Henry yesterday. The men were trusties and were given the job of fixing a gasoline boat owned by one of the officers at the fort. A military policeman was in charge and went out with them on a trial spin in Navy bay. They were only given a limited amount of gasoline but they secretly procured an extra supply and hid it in the boat. When they had gone some distance they were told to turn back. They objected and the policeman commanded them to return. Instead they seized the officer, tied him up securely and laid him in the back of the boat. Then they headed the boat for the foot of Wolfe Island and up the American channel and stopped their boat about two miles east of Cape Vincent. Here they landed and started for the inland. They left the officer in the boat and he was later found by some people who happened to be passing. It is supposed the men are in some New York village.
