BATTALIONS LEAVE CAMP

"Numerous cases have, been reported that alien enemies have enlisted in the Canadian Expeditionary Forces, who have represented themselves to be Serbians or Roumanians. Owing to the great difficulty of determining the nationality of a great many

foreigners, it is hereby notified for the information of all recruiting officers and commanding officers that whenever there is any doubt to the nationality of foreigners when they offer themselves for enlistment, such cases should be, referred to the super-

offer themselves for enlistment, such cases should be referred to the superintendant of immigration. It is important that the man's correct name, age, date of arrival in Canada, name of port of entry (whether Canadian of

port of entry (whether Canadian of American), the name of the steamship and as nearly as possible the date of arrival should be furnished. All such cases should be investigated by the superintendant of immigration be-
