GERMAN STORY

Amherst, N.S., Aug. 23.—In connection with the despatch from Berlin today, regarding alleged ill-treatment and unsanitary conditions at the military detention camp here, Major G. R. Oulton, in command of the detention camp, said tonight that he had never received a complaint from one of the 700 German civilian prisoners confined there, but that, on

the contrary, scores had expressed to him their satisfaction with the conditions.

Major Oulton also said that he had had several visits from the American consul, C. Forman, of Moncton, N.B., who, according to the commandant, had always expressed himself as pleased with the conditions found.
