Governor-General Talks With 300 Germans Interned In Halifax Citadel

HALIFAX, N.S., Aug. 24—An interesting episode in the visit of the governor-general to Halifax was seen yesterday when His Royal Highness was in the citadel. Interned there are about three hundred German prisoners, all officers. The rank and file of Germans are held at Amherst.

The duke went into the enclosure, and the officer who is looked upon as their leader was introduced. His Royal Highness conversed for some time with this German, and passed up and down the lines.

The prisoners raised their hats and saluted as the governor-general passed, and appeared pleased with the visit of the representative of the king.

The duke will today continue his inspection of the forts, and visit the Halifax ocean terminals, now being constructed. Friday he will attend a garden party to be given by Governor MacKeen at Maplewood, and Saturday he will inspect the military camp at Aldershot.
