

PERIODICALS BARRED FROM CANADIAN MAILS

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Ottawa, Aug. 25.—The following extensive list of publications have been debarred from the Canadian mails under the war measures act:

Abendpost, a daily German paper published in Chicago; Al Bayan, a semi-weekly Syrian newspaper published in New York; Amerika Magyar Nepszava, a daily Hungarian paper published in New York; The American Independent, a weekly published in San Francisco; Der Buffalo Demokrat, a daily German paper published in Buffalo; Der Deutsche Lutheraner, a weekly German paper published in Philadelphia; Deutsche Journal, a daily German paper published in New York; The Fatherland, a weekly paper published in New York; Vorwaerts, a Yiddish paper published in New York; The Gaelic American, a weekly paper published in New York; Germania Herold, a daily German paper published in Milwaukee; Germania, a bi-weekly German paper published in Milwaukee; Hindustan Ghedr, a Hindu paper published in San Francisco; The Irish World, a weekly paper published in New York; The International, a monthly paper published in New York; Illinois Staats-Zeitung, a daily paper printed in German in Chicago; Irish Voice, a weekly paper published in Chicago; Issues and Events, a weekly paper published in New York; Josephinum Weekly, a weekly paper published in Columbus, Ohio; Lincoln Freie Presse, a weekly paper printed in German and published at Lincoln, Neb.; Milwaukee Sonntags-Post, a Sunday paper printed in German and published in Milwaukee; New Yorker Staats-Zeitung, a daily paper printed in German and published in New York; New Yorker Herold, a daily paper printed in German and published in New York; New Yorker Revue, a Sunday paper printed in German and published in New York; Narodni List, a daily paper printed in the Croatian language and published in New York; Ohio Waisenfreund, a weekly paper printed in German and published in Columbus; People's Post, a monthly paper published at Indianapolis; Szabadsag (Liberty), a daily paper printed in Hungarian and published at Cleveland; Svoboda, a tri-weekly paper printed in the Ukrainian language and published in Jersey City; Tagliche Volkszeitung, a daily paper printed in German and published in St. Paul, Minn.; Vital Issue, a weekly paper published in New York; The War, a tri-weekly paper edited by Otto Selke and published in Shanghai, also Der Ostasiatische Lloyd, a supplement to The War, edited by C. Fink and published in Shanghai; Wochentliche Volkszeitung, the weekly edition of The Tagliche Volkszeitung, printed in the German language and published in St. Paul, Minn.

Under the terms of the order in Council above quoted, no person in Canada shall be permitted hereafter to be in possession of any such papers or periodicals or of any issues thereof, already published or hereafter to be published, and further, any person in possession of any such papers or periodicals shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or imprisonment for any term not exceeding five years, or to both fine and imprisonment.
