FOUR GERMANS WHO ESCAPED RECAPTURED

One of the Number Refused to Surrender and Was Shot Dead.

AMHERST, Aug. 25--The German prisoners confined in the Amherst In-

ternment Camp will soon appreciate the fact that escape is an almost impossibility, while Col. Morris, the officer commanding and his efficient officers and men are on the job. All those who escaped on Wednesday morning have been captured. Within half an hour after the escape was reported Col. Morris had men with autos scouring every section of the country, while the wires were kept busy notifying the authorities of their escape and giving description of the men. Col. Morris

himself has been most vigilant and last night up to midnight was conducting a search by torchlight at the plaster quarries, where the men were reported to have been seen. He also

had men out on patrol work on bicycles.
