

GERMANS RECAPTURED

Amherst, N.S., August 25.—Three of the four German prisoners who escaped from the internment camp on Wednesday have been recaptured. The other was shot. Two of them had been hiding near the experimental farm at Nappan, and when the other prisoners who had been working at the farm left, a guard was placed in the cook house. Some hours later two of the escaped Germans opened the cook house door in search of food and were ordered to surrender. One did so, but the other ran away. The guard ordered him to halt but he kept

on. Then the guards shot him dead.

The four men who escaped were from the crew of the German steamer Kaiser Wilhelm, and they have been the cause of much trouble at the camp.
