

## GERMAN VOTE ALIENATED.

### Ontario Government Threatened by Paper in Berlin.

Berlin, Ont., Aug. 31.—The Ontario Government has alienated the German vote of the province, according to this week's issue of the Berliner Journal, as the result of issuing the order-in-council to change the name of this city from Berlin to Kitchener, following closely upon the enactment of the Ontario Temperance Act, which comes into force on September 16.

The paper predicts that there will be a reckoning day for the Government when the German vote of the province will show its disapproval of its recent enactment.

The journal urges its readers to endure the name Kitchener for a period of four months, after which steps will be taken to have it changed back to Berlin.
